

Poorly shaped and poorly attached wattle

- Wattles should be well attached, being thick where attached to the lower jowl. This wattle is string like where attached and continuing partway down the wattle. The bottom portion of the wattle appears normal size for the age, (2 ½ weeks). This wattle may get injured or easily pulled off.
- Wattles should be symmetrical, appearing the same in both length and width on both sides of the jowl. They should be well attached to the lower inside jowl area, and be able to swing freely.
- Wattles can be tear drop shaped or straight, or curve slightly inward toward the under jowl area.
- Wattles may be slightly larger toward the bottom than where attached to the jowl but not always. They should always be substantial in size from the jowl to the tip.
