

Toed Out Feet

- Standing normally this hogs front feet point outward rather than straight forward.
- Dew claws are on the ground and nails are longer than normal due to the feet breaking down. Normal walking, wear and tear and friction usually keep the nails worn down.
- This hogs feet are unable to normally or comfortably support its own adult weight and could also possibly be injured during the weight of breeding.
- This could be an inherited factor.
- Per the breeder this hog was registered at 5 months old and appeared good or normal
 in all areas including the feet. The hog still appears good in all areas but as it
 continued to mature and grow it was apparent the front feet were breaking down.
- The breeder has since removed this hog from the production registry.
- The breeder wants the best in his/her registered breeding program and won't take chances with the feet or any other area not measuring up for the long term goals.
